One Stop Talk offers children and youth (aged o-17) immediate access to free mental health support. The program provides single session counselling support and ensures direct referral to additional service when needed. Services are provided through an integrated network of infant, child and youth mental health agencies across Ontario.

EASY TO ACCESS

Access the program online or by phone to connect with registered mental health professionals for brief therapy. There is no limit on the number of times you can contact One Stop Talk.



SESSION DURATION

1-hour long and typically focus on a single issue.

INTERPRETERS AVAILABLE

Services are offered in English and French. You can request an interpreter (available for 200+ languages including ASL) for a session in your preferred language, before connecting with our therapists.

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SESSION OUTCOME

You receive access to help right away and co-develop an 'action plan' after a therapy session.









April 8th Solar Eclipse: Planning to view the solar eclipse on April 8th? Check out this safety information first:

- Looking at the eclipse without proper eye protection could burn your retinas, blur your vision or cause you to lose your eyesight.
- Make sure you have undamaged, safe to use eclipse glasses (ISO Certified and meet ISO 12312-2 international safety standard). To find suppliers of these glasses visit: <u>https://eclipse.aas.org/eye-safety/viewers-</u> filters or check your municipality's website.
- Keep a watch on those you care for during the eclipse, particularly young children, and make sure they do not look at the sun without the right eye protection.
- It is <u>not safe</u> to view the eclipse through sunglasses, a homemade filter, camera/phone lens, telescope, binoculars, or any other optical device.
- If driving during the eclipse, turn on your headlights, watch out for pedestrians, and do not stop on the shoulder.
- If you experience any changes in your vision during or after the eclipse, call Health811, your health care provider or visit a virtual care clinic: www.virtualcareontario.ca.
